Pasteur was *compassionate*, laboring to improve health (through development of vaccines which greatly reduced certain diseases, and through partial sterilization of milk which reduced the risk of other illnesses). These endeavors were also *culturally relevant*, to say the least.

He was *courageous*, making experimental and vocal stands against evolutionary concepts and against those who disbelieved the impact of microbial life.

- 5) The implication of biogenesis (life not being able to come from non-life naturally) is that life came from a non-natural (supernatural) source. Since God is the ultimate supernatural being, and since He is holy, sinners desire to avoid Him. This desire to avoid God causes some to become irrational, insisting that life could have formed from non-life.
